## RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE

### a) Admissions :-

St. Joseph's College of Education is a co-educational Minority College of Education in the State of Karnataka. The college offers instructions in both English & Kannada medium with a total intake of 100 which 50 are Government seats and 50 are management seats.

The Central Admission Cell of the State under the Commissioner of Public Instruction shall monitor the admission to the seats under Government Quota. Admission for management seat shall be made on merit, based on marks obtained in the qualifying examination if any or any other selection process as per the policy of the Central Government/State Government/ University admission from time to time.

Candidates with at least fifty percent marks either in Bachelor's Degree and/or the Master's Degree in Science/Social Science/Humanity, Bachelors in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55 percent marks or any other qualification equivalent thereto are eligible for admission to the programme. SC/ST/OBC/PWD/371(J) and any other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government or State Government whichever is applicable

### b) General Discipline and Code of Behaviour :-

*The following guidelines will help the students to behave in a courteous manner and to maintain general discipline in the college premises*

1. The College starts with the morning assembly at 9.30 a.m. All the students must be present at 9.25 a.m in the college auditorium for the morning assembly.
2. All the students are expected to be in the college during the working hours from 9.25 am to 4:45 pm.

3. All are expected to be punctual and regular in attendance. No student will enter or leave the classroom when the session is on without the permission of the teacher concerned. Latecomers should not enter the classroom, nor should any student leave the college premises without the permission of the Principal. Students are expected to get a gate pass from the Principal to go out of the campus during the class hours.
4. The students are expected to hold values, be polite and courteous respect and greet everyone both inside and outside campus.
5. Students shall compulsorily wear the prescribed college uniform on all working days except Wednesdays and Saturdays. Our students are expected to be clean, tidy and pleasing in appearance without being singular or conspicuous. The attire should be simple and modest.
6. The students are required to wear college Identity Card on all college working days. Failure to wear the college identity card will be treated as misconduct and such students will be barred from entering the campus and classroom.
7. All are expected to keep the college campus, classrooms, auditorium, etc., clean and tidy. Students should see that no damage is done to college property including plants and trees in the campus. Scribbling on wall and furniture is strictly prohibited.
8. Students are expected to spend their free hours in the Library/ Reading room. They should not loiter along the corridor or in the college premises.
9. All are expected to do work (submission of assignments, organising activity, tutorials, etc.,) according to the prescribed time.
10. Please switch off the fans and lights when you are not using or when you come out of the classes.
11. Students are not permitted to enter into the staffroom without the permission of any staff.

13. Smoking, chewing tobacco, pan masala, etc., is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
14. Grievance, complaints or suggestion of any kind can be put in the suggestion box.
15. **Ragging is banned** in the college campus. Anyone found guilty of ragging and /or abetting ragging is liable to be punished as per the severity and a complaint can be given to anti-ragging committee (Link to submit a complaint is given in college website). The culprits will be dismissed from the college as per the decision of the management.
16. Students are forbidden from attending or organising any meeting, collecting money for any purpose, circulating or displaying any notice in the premises without the permission of the Principal. No celebration is arranged in the campus without the written permission of the Principal or the concerned Teacher.
17. Students from other institutions and outsiders shall not meet or interact with the students of the college inside the campus without the prior written consent of the Principal.
18. The college is not responsible for any loss of things in the campus.
19. The students who prove their unfitness for the vocation of teaching during the course of study, who appear to be unsatisfactory in character and conduct and defective in disposition will have to discontinue his/her studies in the institution and will be sent away from the college. The course certificate for the university examination will not be granted to any student unless the Principal is satisfied with his/her a) conduct b) progress in studies c) attendance.
20. The Principal is the ultimate disciplinary authority in the college. In the interest of the institution and for the sake of discipline, the management is entitled to take any punitive action on any student for his/her misconduct.

**c) Attendance:-**

1. The students are required to be punctual and maintain requirements of attendance, which are mandatory as per norms laid down by the University of Mysore.
2. B.Ed is a full-time course and students shall not take up any employment /course, part-time or full time during their B.Ed programme. Students found violating this rule shall be removed from the course. In case such act is found post completion of course, necessary action needs to be taken to withdraw the degree.
3. Each course shall be taken as unit for the purpose of calculating attendance for theory and practicum. The student shall be deemed to have satisfied the requirement of attendance, progress and conduct if he/she has attended not less than 80% of the total number the working hours for theory courses, and with practicum 90% (inclusive of field attachment and internship held up to the end of the semester including lectures, seminars, group discussion, project work, practicum, internship, tests, etc.) in each semester. The relaxation shall be as per the State Government circulars, if any.
4. If a student needs leave, he/she should submit a leave letter prior to the date to the respective in-charge teacher for attendance with the signature of the principal. Absence without leave letter is punishable.
5. No student will be granted more than ten days of leave in a year and more than seven at a stretch inclusive of Saturdays and Sundays.
6. A student on medical leave must produce the Medical Certificate along with the leave application duly signed by the parent/guardian when he/she re-joins the class.
7. A student absenting himself without intimation for 15 consecutive working days will be removed from the rolls.

#### **d) College Library:-**

Library is the soul of any institution. It is a centre of acquiring, processing, preserving and disseminating information to the user community with the motto of empowering knowledge. St. Joseph's library has well trained staff and an automated library system to enrich the user community with a wide range of academic resources such as books, periodicals, online periodicals, databases, back volumes, CDs/DVDs, project reports, audio / video cassettes, and question bank. The library collection includes 16,713 books, both for borrowing and reference. Free internet access is allowed to students and faculty of the college. The college is a member of INFLIBNET-NLIST Programme.

#### ***Library Rules***

- The library will remain open from 9:30 am to 5:00 pm on all working days and all Saturdays from 9:30 am to 01:30 pm.
- Students are not allowed to bring their personal books, printed materials, electronic equipment into the library.
- Students should strictly maintain discipline and silence.
- The books from reference section and journals will not be issued.
- The books borrowed must be returned on or before the due date. If failed to do so, fine of Rs.5/- will be charged per day per book.

## **Regulations Governing Two Year Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) Programme Universities of Karnataka State**

The Bachelor of Education (B.Ed) Programme is a two year professional programme in the field of Teacher Education which aims at preparing school teachers, generally known as B.Ed. This is a professional programme that prepares teachers for upper primary, secondary level (classes VI -X) and higher secondary level (classes XI-XII). It also aims at preparing, practitioners and other educational professionals including manpower for curriculum development, planners, administrators, supervisors, school principals and for extension activities.

In exercise of the powers conferred under Chapter-II 5 A and B of the Karnataka State Higher Education Act 2010, the provisions made in the Karnataka State University Act 2000 and as per the guidelines of NCTE in the Gazette of India Notification extraordinary December 2014, the Government of Karnataka provides the following Regulations to govern two year B.Ed Programme hereafter called B.Ed under choice based credit system [CBCS] and continuous assessment grading pattern (CAGP) programme offered in the TEI's affiliated and constituent colleges of Universities of Karnataka States from the academic year 2015-16 onwards. The completion of the programme shall lead to B.Ed degree. The detailed regulations and syllabus are given in the College website.

## **1. Eligibility and Choice of pedagogic Subjects:-**

Candidates seeking admission to the B.Ed programme should be as prescribed by NCTE and UGC and State Government as listed below:

Candidates with at least 50% marks either in Bachelor's Degree and/or the Master's Degree in Science/Social Science/Humanity, Bachelors in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other qualification equivalent thereto are eligible for admission to the programme. SC/ST/OBC/PWD/371(J) and any other categories/type shall be as per the rules of the Central Government/State Government whichever is applicable.

The candidate should specify whether he desires to be a

- a) Teacher for 6-8 & 9-10 std eligibility or
- b) Teacher for 8-10 and 11-12std eligibility (only for PG Qualified)

The Postgraduate candidates have the option to take higher secondary level subject according to their PG qualification along with one of the secondary school subjects. This specialization exists for the III Semester and IV Semester. For the second semester, there are no pedagogic papers specialized in any school subject. The pedagogic subject for the first semester will be on any two of the following, one each from any two groups:

The pedagogic subject choice (except languages) shall be based on the candidate qualifying to have studied the subject as optional for the three year course with due marks equivalent to the State Govt. Degree programme. Language pedagogy shall be given based on study of the subject either as optional or as basic.

The choice of subject to be given to each candidate shall fall in accordance with the qualification of the candidate with his optional and languages studies and the State appointment provision presently in operation as advertised by State Government of Karnataka.

The pedagogic subject of advanced pedagogy of higher secondary shall be given only to the students with PG qualification and eligible to be appointed at higher secondary.

## **2. Medium of Instruction:-**

Medium of instruction for the course is English or Kannada or both. However, candidates may write the examination in Kannada for all papers except for language pedagogy papers. The language pedagogy paper shall be written in the language as directed in the subject of study.

### **3. Curricular Components:-**

The course shall have the curricular components namely:

- a. Perspective Courses (Per-C)
- b. Pedagogic Courses (Ped- C)
- c. Enhancing Professional Competencies Courses (EPC-C)
- d. Engagement with Field Courses (EWF-C)

Each component of the curriculum will have sub component with course titles of study with specific credits and scheme of examination.
